January 2006

Ten (10) Organizations Launch “How Shall We Grow”

August 2007

Over 20,000 Citizens and Leaders create a Shared Regional Growth Vision; local Elected Officials sign a Regional Growth Compact

December 2007

Congress of Regional Leaders established to initiate governmental Regional Growth Policies that will support the Vision

- Seven (7) County Commission Chairs
- Seven (7) Mayors representing Eighty-Six (86) Cities
- Two (2) Elected School Board Members

- *Central Florida Partnership* Commissions one-on-one interviews with Fifty-Three (53) Regional Leaders and Transportation Experts on Regional Transportation Priorities

January 2008

Central Florida Partnership announces the formation of the Central Florida Transportation Corridors “Task Force” at the Regional Leadership Conference
